Regional Monitoring Committee (Central Zone) Review Meeting

Minutes of Meeting

Hon. National Green Tribunal in its Order dated 31.08.2018 constituted a Regional Monitoring Committee (Central Zone) comprising of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Former Judge of MP High Court K.K.Trivedi, Chairman, Principal Secretary of Urban Development & Housing Department GoMP as Member Secretary, Principal Secretary of Urban Development Department of State of Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh as Member, Member Secretaries of State Pollution Control Board of State of Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh and representative of Central pollution control board (CPCB) as Member.

First meeting of RMC(C) was held on 12th November 2018 under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Former Judge of MP High Court K.K.Trivedi.

Principal Secretary of Urban Development & Housing Department GoMP welcomed all members of committee and informed the Agenda of the meeting to the members.

Hon. Chairman began the meeting with reiterating the order of Hon' NGT (Principal Bench) dated 31.08.2018 and 30.10.2018 "...RMCs shall also ensure that mixing of bio-medical waste with municipal solid waste does not take place and bio- medical waste processed in accordance with The Bio-Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016..." and "...Regional Monitoring Committees (RMCs) may consider identifying one or more cities or

towns to be the model for a State in the matter of compliance with the Municipal Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016, considering the available models or otherwise. For this purpose, RMCs may identify a team of three persons as accountable. Such teams may visit the place or places which may be considered to be successful model(s)." Chairman also reiterated that this will help in understanding the best model's and replicating as far as possible. Hon. Chairman also mentioned that managing/supervision of small area is easier compared to bigger area.

Thereafter Principal Secretary, Urban Development & Housing, GoMP informed about the Journey of Solid Waste Management in MP and present status of implementation of SWM Rules, 2016 in the state. He informed the committee, about the state of SWM prior to 2014 and strategies state has adopted since 2014. He also informed that State has adopted Regional Landfill -Cluster basis approach for implementation through Public Private Partnership (PPP) and 26 clusters have been formed, of which 3 Ujjain, Jabalpur and Katni are fully operational and 09 more are under different stages of implementation whereas 14 are presently open for bidding. State's strategy for waste treatment focuses on creation of wealth from waste (through Compost, RDF or energy). It was also informed to the committee that in Indore, Waste to CNG is in operation and currently about 18 Buses use gas from Mandi waste (Choithram Mandi) which has also reduced the operating fuel cost. It was also informed that state has tied-up with National Fertilizer Limited (NFL) for compost selling in market.

Principal Secretary, Urban Development & Housing, GoMP, suggested that State Rural departments shall be asked to submit the action plan for waste management, so that committee can consider status of implementation of SWM Rules 2016 across the rural areas as well.

Dy. Director SBM(U)-UAD, GoMP through presentation, informed to the committee that State has continuously supported the ULBs and provided grants to not only upgrade the existing waste collection infrastructure but also to create new infrastructure and also include ICT based monitoring for efficient implementation. It was also informed that State is continuously monitoring other environmental parameters such as water, air, weather quality etc. Committee was also informed that State has taken several initiatives for integration of Rag pickers to the mainstream of waste collection and segregation process across all urban local bodies.

Secretary, Urban Administration & Development, Govt. of Chhattisgarh informed about the initiatives State of Chhattisgarh has taken to implement Solid waste management rules 2016. It was informed that Govt. of Chhattisgarh has adopted Ambikapur Model to across all 166 cities and for Raipur and Bilaspur standalone model is adopted. It was informed to the committee that how women SHGs "Didis" are empowered and how waste collection is converted to livelihood model for such SHGs. Secretary also informed about the innovative attendance system wherein instead biometric "selfies" are captured and to

be uploaded. Advantage of such system is that it also provides the current location of staff. Committee was also informed about the Garbage Clinic, where waste is further segregated "Tertiary Segregation" and thereafter revenue is generated from sale. It was informed that state is currently practicing 100% waste collection and source segregation and processing about 84.22% of waste.

Secretary, Urban Administration & Development, Govt. of Chhattisgarh also informed that Chhattisgarh has taken advantage of convergence of various schemes from Central and State Govt. Namely NULM, Horticulture, SBM(U), 13th Finance Commission, Councillor fund etc. It was also informed to the committee that legacy waste remediation is completed across 160 ULBs and in remaining it will be completed within the timeline mentioned in SWM Rules 2016.

Committee was also informed about the tie-up with cement industry for processing of plastic waste generated in the state.

Representative from Madhya Pradesh Pollution Control Board, informed committee that regular meetings with state urban development department are already being conducted. Regarding Bio Medical waste treatment Chairman was informed that currently State generates about 14.8 TPD of bio medical waste from hospitals and clinics across the State and there are about 11 facility for scientific treatment of about 13.5 TPD capacity.

Representative from Central Pollution Control Board informed to the committee that in its order dated 12.10.2018 Hon. National Green Tribunal "We further modify the order dated 20.08.2018 of O.A No. 606/2018 (Compliance of Municipal Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016) and to clarify that the implementation and compliance of Plastic Waste Management Rule, 2016, Construction and Demolition Waste Rules, 2016 and Bio-medical Waste Rules, 2016 will also be included in the scope of our order dated 20.8.2018 for Apex and the Regional Committees. However, the Apex and Regional Committees may opt concerned Members/Departments of States and UTs dealing with these issues".


Representative from Govt. of Rajasthan, handed over a short note to Hon. Chairman and informed that they have received information on 9th and hence could not prepare a presentation. In next meeting they will present the status.

Thereafter, Hon. Chairman suggested that action on following points be taken.

1. To ensure Bio-medical waste (from Hospitals / clinics etc.) is collected separately and proper treatment mechanism is established without mixing with other waste streams.
2. RMCs / Three Member Committed shall visit the model towns and replicate it as far as possible.
3. State Rural Department shall submit an Action Plan about Waste Management in Rural areas.

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4. State should extensively conduct awareness (Information, Education and Communication) activities, to educate citizens about SWM and other sanitation issues.
 5. State of Rajasthan to submit Report & Annexure and presentation to Chairman, as directed by Chairman to representative from UAD, Govt. of Rajasthan.
 6. States should submit 2 Page Note about the present status and compliance status of SWM Rules 2016 to Chairman.
 7. State PCB and CPCB Should also submit report to Chairman.
 8. To ensure Ground level / grass root implementation.
 9. Each state to identify how to integrate Cantonment in the state.
 10. Chairman suggested to Govt. of Chhatisgarh (and to whoever applicable) to create a appropriate cadre (sanitation/health) and its deployment so that effective implementation & its sustainability of SWM Rules 2016 can be ensured.
