



Agenda of meeting :

The agenda of meeting was based on the issues raised and discussed in review meeting of “Regional Monitoring Committee -Central zone” held on dated 18th January 2019 and the suggestions given by the Chairman of the committee, Hon. Mr. justice K K Trivedi (former Judge of Madhya Pradesh High Court).

Back Ground :

Hon. National Green Tribunal(PB)Delhi in its order dated 16th January 2019 constituted State Level Committee under the chairmanship of Hon. Mr. justice K.K. Trivedi (former Judge of Madhya Pradesh High Court). The committee has representatives from the state and centre as under :

- Principal secretary, Environment ,Government of Madhya Pradesh.
 - Secretary, Urban Development, Government of Madhya Pradesh.
 - Secretary, Rural development, Government of Madhya Pradesh.
 - Secretary ,Public Health and Family Welfare , Government of Madhya Pradesh.
 - Representative of Central Pollution Control Board.
 - Member Secretary, Madhya Pradesh Pollution Control Board.

Minutes of the meeting:

At the outset, Principal Secretary, Environment ,Government of Madhya Pradesh welcomed Hon. Chairperson and all members of Committee and apprised about the purpose of meeting of “State Level Committee” constituted by Hon. NGT (Principal Bench) Delhi vide order dated 16.1.19 in OA No. 606 / 2018 and requested to all committee members to ensure compliance of order.

Hon. Chairperson opined that the compliance of provisions of rules still required to be implemented fully at ground level and in Rural areas. He drew the

attention of committee members towards “Para 7 (page 23)” of order wherein Hon. NGT has directed Chief Secretaries/ Administrators of all the states to review the progress on all the issues mentioned in the order and to hold first meeting within one month from the date of order passed. After the review by chief secretaries the status reports of compliance and immediate Future Plans have to be presented/ filed before the Tribunal. Hon. Chairperson emphasized to ensure compliance of the order at the ground level.

Hon. Chairperson suggested that Urban Development Department should define the monitoring and supervision mechanism for the projects which are being run on PPP mode and powers should be delegated to designated officers so that the defaulters could be identified and punished. He cited the example of Chhattisgarh state where separate rules have been formulated for agreement between waste management Agencies and Urban Development Department and the same practice may be adopted in Madhya Pradesh.

The officers of Urban Development Department made power point presentation before committee members and submitted point wise reply of agenda and presented current status of waste management being practiced in all 378 Urban Local Bodies as below:-

- *UADD inform that in all 378 urban local bodies about 98% waste is being collected and 80% waste is being segregated at source. The data are being filled by respective urban local bodies on the MIS portal.*
- *Indore Municipal Corporation has already capped huge quantities of legacy waste at Devguradia site.*
- *Bhopal Municipal Corporation and Ratlam Municipal Corporation dumping sites at Bhanpur and Karandi respectively are being capped after due bio-remediation as per SWM Rules 2016.*
- *UADD is compiling list of dumping sites of various Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) which need disposal of its legacy waste.*
- *Madhya Pradesh Government in compliance has already enacted complete ban on plastic carry bags and the ban is being enforced by the respective authorities at different levels.*
- *05 PPP partners have been appointed in Khandwa ,Chhatarpur, Jabalpur, Neemuch and Singrauli clusters recently. Tenders for the remaining clusters would be floated shortly.*
- *All ULBs have been directed to set-up monitoring and evaluation system for compliance of each component of SWM.*

- *In ULBs where ISWM through PPP is operational, Independent Engineer (IE Agency) has been appointed to monitor and evaluate the performance. Once all 26 projects become operational, this system shall be applied for all 378 ULBs of the State.*
 - *All the waste collection vehicles in the state are GPS Enabled with a pre-defined route map to follow during collection and transportation of waste.*
 - *The composting sites (1112) across all the State are geo-tagged to ensure monitoring and evaluation at ULB Level.*
 - *UADD has been periodically advising ULBs to execute agreements with waste collection agencies and SHGs, wherever possible.*
 - *UADD has directed ULBs to promote decentralized composting by bulk waste generator (BWG) and other citizens, as far as possible in compliance with SWM Rules, 2016.*
 - *State Government has deployed manpower at divisional levels through project implementation units (PIUs) for monitoring and evaluation. These PIU teams are performing the requisite tasks through periodical inspection at ULB level.*
 - *The IEC materials are being translated from English to Hindi and also UADD is preparing new material in Hindi.*
 - *Identification of Best and innovative practices adopted by selected ULBs shall be done after results of Swachh Survekshan-2019 are declared.*
 - *Two meetings of State level advisory body has been held on 16th Feb 2018 and 11th Sept 2018.*
 - *Urban Development Department informed that they have taken lot of initiative for enforcement of provisions of rules , regular meetings are going on in this direction and workable action plan will be prepared within one month.*
 - *Urban Development Department informed that tender have been floated to setup materials recovery facility at all places including Mini material recovery facility with the provision of market linkage for recycling of material.*
- Hon. Chairperson suggested UADD officials to develop IT based monitoring mechanism to track ground reality of waste management.
 - Hon. Chairperson also suggested to analyze the data of last 3 months and to prepare remedial measures with timeline for correction of the observed gap (if any).
 - Hon. Chairperson suggested to prepare graphs of data depicting the improvement and circulate among the officials, upload on website and also inform NGT. He also inquired about the modus operandi of waste management for small villages and Gram Panchayat etc. He asked UADD official, as to whether cluster wise plan

could be prepared for Rural area to establish the viability of waste management so that the scenario of waste collection, its transportation ,treatment and disposal could also be improved in rural areas on the lines of urban areas.

Hon. Chairperson suggested that apart from state level committee, the compliance of Solid Waste Management Rules 2016 should also be reviewed at Divisional level in close coordination with district Administration and concerned urban local bodies.

Chairman MP Pollution Control Board suggested UADD Officials to identify specific officer and encourage them to coordinate at division and district level so that ground truthing could be done on regular basis.

The officials of MP Pollution Control Board informed the committee about the status of Biomedical Waste and Plastic Waste Management as under: -

1. Bio-Medical Waste Management :

The status of Bio-Medical waste management in M.P. is as follows :-

- 1.1 In M.P. 14.20 Tons/day Bio-medical waste is being generated out of which 13.5 Ton/day is being collected, treated and disposed through the operators of Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment and Disposal Facilities (CBWTFs).*
- 1.2 In M.P. 6793 Health care facilities (HCFs) have been inventorized, which also include veterinary hospitals, Non bedded Health care facilities like Dental clinics, Pathology Labs, Dispensaries etc.*
- 1.3 So far 3601 no. HCFs have obtained authorization from M. P. Pollution Control Board and other HCFs are in process of obtaining authorization.*
- 1.4 Board is in process of grant of one time authorization under BMWM Rules, 2016 as amended 2018 to non bedded health care facilities generating bio-medical waste.*
- 1.5 At present 11 nos. of Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment and Disposal Facilities (CBWTFs) are operational for the collection, transportation, treatment and disposal of bio-medical waste.*
- 1.6 Apart from above 5 nos. of new CBWTFs are also proposed in State at Ujjain, Raisen, Mandla, Morena and Village Ratua, Bhopal and installing incinerators as per the provision of BMWM Rules, 2016.*

2. Status of Plastic Waste Management :

- *The State Government has imposed complete ban on the production, storage, transportation, sale and use of plastic carry bags in the entire State from 24/5/2017.*
- *All the carry bag manufacturing units are closed at present.*
- *The estimated quantity of plastic waste generated from Urban Local Bodies is around 4.5% of the Municipal Solid waste.*
- *Estimated plastic waste generation – 300 MT/D*
- *Non recyclable plastic waste 25% of total – 75 MT/D .*

Co processing of Plastic waste:

- *The co-processing of Plastic Waste in the Cement Kilns started in the State since 2008-09.*
- *Permission has been granted to 11 Cement Industries for co processing of plastic waste.*
- *The consented capacity of co processing of plastic waste of all the above Cement Industries is – 54219 MT (Up to Nov. 2018)*
- *Total quantity of Plastic Waste co-processed by the Cement Industries:*
 - *Up to 2017 - 2018 - 47700.23 MT*
 - *2018 - 2019 - 6558 MT (Up to Nov. 2018)*
- *During 2017-18 , the Municipal Local Bodies sent Plastic Waste around:-*
 - *7558.63 MT to the cement industries for co-processing,*
 - *10839.00 MT for the recycling units.*
 - *373.00 MT for utilization in the Road construction.*

Hon. Chairperson suggested to set up / revive the chain of local Rag pickers to enhance channelization for collection of non recyclable plastic waste, so that it could be utilized in cement industries for Co-processing / resource recovery.

Regarding the Bio-medical waste management, Hon. Chairperson suggested to Secretary Public Health and Family Welfare to review the gap pertaining to authorization of all Govt. Healthcare facilities of rural areas to ensure their Biomedical Waste collection and treatment through Common facilities.

In the end, Hon. Chairperson asked all the officers of the committee to ensure implementation of various provisions of solid waste, Bio- Medical and Plastic Waste Management Rules and directions of Hon. NGT.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks from Principal Secretary ,Environment & Chairman of M.P. Pollution Control Board to Hon Chairperson and all members of the committee.
