Points suggested by Hon Mr. Justice K.K.Trivedi in last meeting dated 7.2.19 :

1. Pertaining to UADD :

- Progress of development of IT based monitoring mechanism to track ground reality of waste management. (UADD)
- Adoption of remedial measures with timeline for correction of the observed gap in implementation

- Preparation of graphs of data depicting the improvement in waste management and circulate among the officials, upload on website and also to inform NGT.
- The status of review of compliance of Solid Waste Management Rules 2016 at Divisional level in coordination with district Administration and concerned Urban local bodies.
- Posting of field officers to coordinate at division and district level for ground truthing of implementation.
- Progress on setting up / revive the chain of local Rag pickers to enhance channelization for collection of non recyclable plastic waste.

2. Pertaining to Rural Dev. Deptt :

- Discussion: As to whether cluster wise plan could be prepared for Rural areas to establish the viability of waste management so that the scenario of waste collection, its transportation, treatment and disposal could also be improved in rural areas on the lines of urban areas.

3. Pertaining to Public Health and Family Welfare Deptt :

- Review the gap pertaining to authorization of all Govt. Healthcare facilities of rural areas to ensure their Biomedical Waste collection and treatment through Common facilities.



Agenda of meeting :

The agenda of meeting was based on the issues raised and discussed in review meeting of “State Monitoring Committee” held on 07th February 2019 and the suggestions given by the Chairman of the committee, Hon. Mr. Justice K K Trivedi (former Judge of Madhya Pradesh High Court).

Back Ground :

Hon. National Green Tribunal (PB) Delhi in its order dated 16th January 2019 constituted “State Monitoring Committee” under the chairmanship of Hon. Mr. justice K.K. Trivedi. The committee has members as under:

- Principal Secretary, Environment ,Government of Madhya Pradesh.
 - Secretary, Urban Development, Government of Madhya Pradesh.
 - Secretary, Rural development, Government of Madhya Pradesh.
 - Secretary, Public Health and Family Welfare, Government of Madhya Pradesh.
 - Representative of Central Pollution Control Board.
 - Member Secretary, Madhya Pradesh Pollution Control Board.
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Minutes of the meeting:

The review meeting was held in conference hall of M.P. Pollution Control Board on 20th March 2019 under the chairmanship of Hon. Mr. Justice K K Trivedi (former Judge of Madhya Pradesh High Court). Principal Secretary, Environment, Government of Madhya Pradesh welcomed Hon. Chairperson and all members of Committee and apprised about the purpose of the meeting.

Hon. Chairperson opined that strict compliance of provisions of rules was still required to be implemented at ground level and particularly in rural areas.

Hon. Chairperson suggested that Urban Development Department should evolve IT based monitoring and supervision mechanism for the PPP projects and powers should not only be delegated to 2- 3 designated officers but it should be expanded in substantial so that more and more defaulters could be identified and punished.

The officers of Urban Development Department submitted point wise reply of agenda and presented current status of waste management being practiced in all 378 Urban Local Bodies as below:-

- *UADD is monitoring about 25 parameters of waste management through swachchhata app.*
- *Outsourcing consultant from 01st April for data / field verification in all 16 Regional Office for two months.*
- *Recently UADD called a meeting of 51 urban local bodies and chalked out detailed time bound program for compliance as follows*
 - a. *Dustbin free cities by 31st May 2019*
 - b. *Door to Door Collection in remaining 40 ULBs by 31st May 2019.*
 - c. *Segregation of waste at source in all ULBs by 31st May 2019.*
 - d. *Development of Transfer Station in all million plus cities*
 - e. *Regular Street sweeping of residential and commercial areas.*
 - f. *Provision of treatment of Septic tank sludge has been made in 44 Urban Local Bodies of various size like smallest in Shahganj, Budhni and bigger plant at Ujjain.*
 - g. *34 Urban Local Bodies having population more than 1.0 lakh, are covered under Amrut scheme for sewage treatment.*
 - h. *Material Recovery Facilities and decentralized Composting facilities will be developed by 31st July 2019 in all 34 ULBs having population >1.0 lakh.*
 - i. *UADD is also planning a model for solid waste management for every town other than the cluster approach, for this purpose the process of*

land allotment is in advance stage which will be finalized by 30th September 2019.

- j. As regard Construction & Demolition Waste processing facilities, UADD has taken this task on priority and preparing model document for the same so that all Urban Local Bodies could work on the same line of direction. For this purpose 51 Urban Local Bodies(ULBs) have been selected.
- k. Madhya Pradesh Government in compliance has already enacted complete ban on plastic carry bags and the ban is being enforced by the respective authorities at different levels. UADD is also imposing fine on polythene carry bag users.
- l. UADD is also in process of development citizen complaint redressal cell by 31st May 2019.
- m. UADD is also making sincere efforts for remediation of Legacy waste dump sites and cleaning of all drains and fixing of wire net on small and big drains.
- n. Katni cluster has been commenced therefore efforts will be made to associate nearby villages in the cluster for Holistic waste management.

C E O of Rural Development Authority has informed that there are two challenges in waste management at village level i.e. firstly the Technical Support to the working model and secondly arrangement of financial resources for implementation, operation & maintenance of the schemes and acceptance /consent of villages on taxation for cleanliness.

Rural Development Department informed that they are giving technical and financial support and training to the villagers for waste management. For this purpose they have identified 362 villages having population more than 5000 and DPRs have been prepared for 21 villages. Under this scheme small and big villages will be covered under a cluster at each block level for effective management of solid waste. So far 16 Private Agencies have been applied out of which 06 agencies have been shortlisted and they will work at District level under supervision of State Rural Livelihood Mission .Under this scheme provision of imposition of cleanliness fee has been made for sustenance of model financially.

Principal Secretary Environment asked Rural Development Department officials to share DPR with MPPCB so that the main features of schemes could be understood.

It is also informed by Rural Road Development Corporation that plastic waste is being used in rural area roads and so far plastic waste has been utilized in about 6000 km roads.

Principal Secretary Environment informed that MP Pollution Control Board randomly cross checked the status of implementation of Solid Waste Management Rules and Regional Offices have inspected 32 urban local bodies and it is concluded that there are lot of deviations found in field data received from Urban Administration And Development Department with respect to ; Site Selection for Processing, Site allotment , Site Construction, Landfill Sites Selection, Land fill Construction, at source Segregation of Waste, Collection Storage and Transportation Facility of C & D waste and landfill site Treatment.

Principal Secretary Environment suggested that Urban Administration and Development Department may also depute Joint director level officers for verification of field data being received on Swachehhata Survey Portal.

As regards the fines collected against the polythene bags users . it is informed by MPPCB that so far about 50 tons of polythene Bags have been seized and Rs. 41.77 Lakhs has been collected from violators.

Suggestions given by Hon Justice K K Trivedi :


- Hon. Chairperson suggested that Urban Administration and Development Department should exercise their power of taxation and model rules may be implemented incorporating "User charges system" in their bye laws so that adequate funding could be ensured for operation and maintenance of public private partnership based models.
- Urban Administration and Development Department may also impose fine on group housing societies, residential buildings, as also done in Karnataka and the same could be incorporated in bye laws of urban local body.
- There should be provision of Sewage Treatment Plant in every housing project/society and no discharge of sewage should meet the nearby water body. UADD should review their rules regarding provision of STPs in residential buildings, Group Housing societies / Colonies etc.
- It is reiterated that even treated sewage should not be discharged in water body as per orders of Hon. Supreme Court of India. The law of the land should be complied strictly.
- UADD should also look into the public drains encroachment and cleaning of road dust and removal of encroachment from roads.

- The Urban population is only 28% whereas the rural population is 72%, therefore the rural areas / villages may be associated in clusters defined for urban areas for maximum use of resources. For this purpose an agreement may be executed between UADD and Rural Development Department.
- As regard proper Collection, Transportation, Treatment and Disposal of waste of Government Hospitals, it is suggested that Health Department should also keep vigil over waste disposal practices of private hospitals, for this purpose Joint Director level officer may be directed to keep constant vigil over the waste disposal of private hospitals. Deep burial should be discouraged.
- The veterinary and animal husbandry department should also obtain authorization from MP pollution control board and the Animal waste should also be disposed off as per the rules.

In the end of the meeting Hon. Chairperson also pointed out non-submission of minutes of the meeting from Municipal Corporation Jabalpur and Rewa and directed to Secretary UADD for necessary action.

All the members of the committee were also reminded to look in to the directions of Hon. NGT (PB) passed in the matter of Almitra H. Patel Vs GOI in OA no 199 / 2014 dated 2.1.2017 and ensure its compliance.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks from Principal Secretary, Environment & Chairman of M.P. Pollution Control Board to Hon Chairperson and all members of the committee.
