

**Strategy adopted by ULBs for collection and processing of C&D Waste**

The State is in process of drafting Construction and Demolition Waste Processing Policy. Once finalized, the State would ensure that all the ULBs in the State have the required infrastructure to manage C&D Waste from collection to disposal.

The waste hierarchy for C&D Waste can be similar to the waste hierarchy of Solid Waste (Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 - Rule 3). The waste hierarchy would be prioritized and managed in the following order - Reduction, Reuse, Recycling, Recovery and Disposal with reduction and reuse being the most preferred option and disposal at the landfill being the least.

The State aims to move towards - 3 R (Reduce-Reuse-Recycle) and the ULBs need to ensure that Construction and Demolition Waste needs to be utilized to the maximum level and only inert, which is not of any use, needs to be sent to the landfill.

**State's plan for big cities**

The State plans to set up C&D Waste Processing Plants in big cities (>10 lakh of population) that generate high amount of C&D waste. Currently, Indore Municipal Corporation has functional C&D Waste Processing Plant on PPP basis with current capacity of 100 TPD. In addition, C&D Waste Processing Plants are also operational in Ujjain Municipal Corporation, Jabalpur Municipal Corporation, Bhopal Municipal Corporation. Smaller ULBs have provided arrangement for material, Segregation/Recovery.

### **State's action plan for smaller ULBs:**

The State has instructed all the ULBS to establish mechanism for collection, processing and disposal of C&D waste as follows:

1. The State has issued instructions to ULBs to set up designated Collection Centers for collecting C&D waste
2. The C&D waste should be collected from the premises of non-bulk waste generators through mobile collection units and from bulk generators through designated collection points.
3. ULBs are advised to involve private operators, if required, for collection of C&D waste
4. ULBS are also instructed to fix charges for C&D waste collection
5. Segregated C&D Raw Waste is to be used in approved construction activities in non-structural applications such as lower layers of road pavements, inner colony roads, filling of plinth and basement, etc.

As per Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) Portal:

- 333 ULBs have "C&D Waste Helpline" in place
- 332 ULBs have notified user charges for services and fines for open dumping of C&D waste
- 338 ULBs have dedicated vehicles for collection and transportation of C&D waste
- 318 ULBs have dedicated areas earmarked to keep C&D waste in the city
